"TAZRIA-METZORAH" IN A NUTSHELL ...



The name of the Parshah, "Tazria," means "conceives" and it is found in [Leviticus 12:2](#). The name of the [Parshah](#), "Metzora," is often translated as "leper" and it is found in [Leviticus 14:2](#).

The Parshah of [Tazria](#) continues the discussion of the laws of *tumah v'taharah*, ritual [impurity](#) and purity.

A [woman](#) giving [birth](#) should undergo a process of purification, which includes immersing in a [mikvah](#) (a naturally gathered pool of water) and bringing offerings to the [Holy Temple](#). All male infants are to be [circumcised](#) on the [eighth day](#) of life.

[Tzaraat](#) (often mistranslated as [leprosy](#)) is a supra-natural plague, which can afflict people as well as garments or homes. If white or pink patches appear on a person's skin (dark red or green in garments), a [kohen](#) is summoned. Judging by [various signs](#), such as an increase in size of the afflicted area after a seven-day quarantine, the [kohen](#) pronounces it [tamei](#) (impure) or [tahor](#) (pure).

A person afflicted with [tzaraat](#) must dwell alone outside of the camp (or city) until he is healed. The afflicted area in a garment or home must be re-

moved; if the [tzaraat](#) recurs, the entire garment or home must be destroyed.

As outlined at the start of [the portion of Metzora](#), when the [metzora](#) ("leper") heals, he or she is purified by the [kohen](#) with a special procedure involving two birds, spring water in an earthen vessel, a piece of cedar wood, a scarlet thread and a bundle of hyssop.

When a [home](#) is afflicted with [tzaraat](#), in a process lasting as long as nineteen days, a [kohen](#) determines [if the house can be purified](#), or whether it must be demolished.

Ritual impurity is also engendered through a seminal or other discharge in a man, and [menstruation](#) or other discharge of blood in a woman, necessitating purification through immersion in a [mikvah](#).

TORAH GEM:

Songs for Rosh Chodesh

"He made the moon for festivals, the sun knows its destination." (Psalm 104:19) Psalm 104 is the Song of the Day for Rosh Chodesh, the first day the new month. Tur (Orach Chaim 423) explains that the Psamist alludes to the new month in verse 19. Rav Yitzchak Abohab explains that these words, "He made the moon for the festivals," are not merely a casual allusion to the new month.

Rather, they set the tone of this entire psalm, whose main theme is God's complete mastery over every aspect of creation. Throughout the monthly lunar cycle, the size of the moon visibly

waxes and wanes, to demonstrate dramatically that God has total mastery over His creations.

No other natural phenomenon conveys this message as vividly and forcefully as the moon's cycle. Thus, the theme of the New Moon complements the theme of the entire hymn of praise to the Master of Creation.

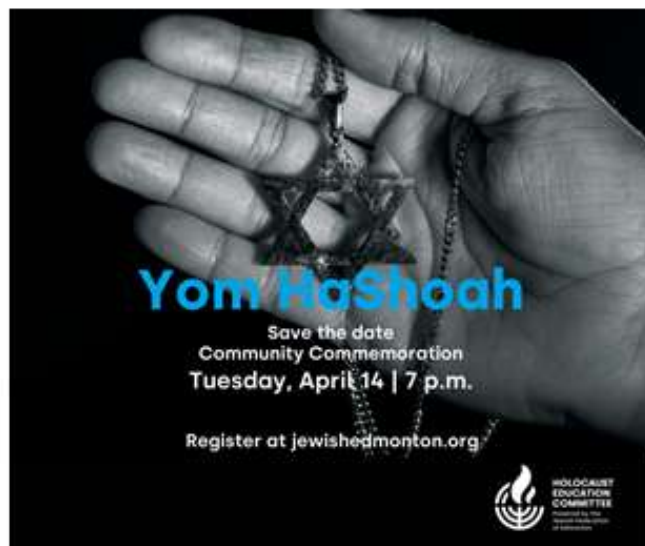
Holocaust Remembrance in Edmonton

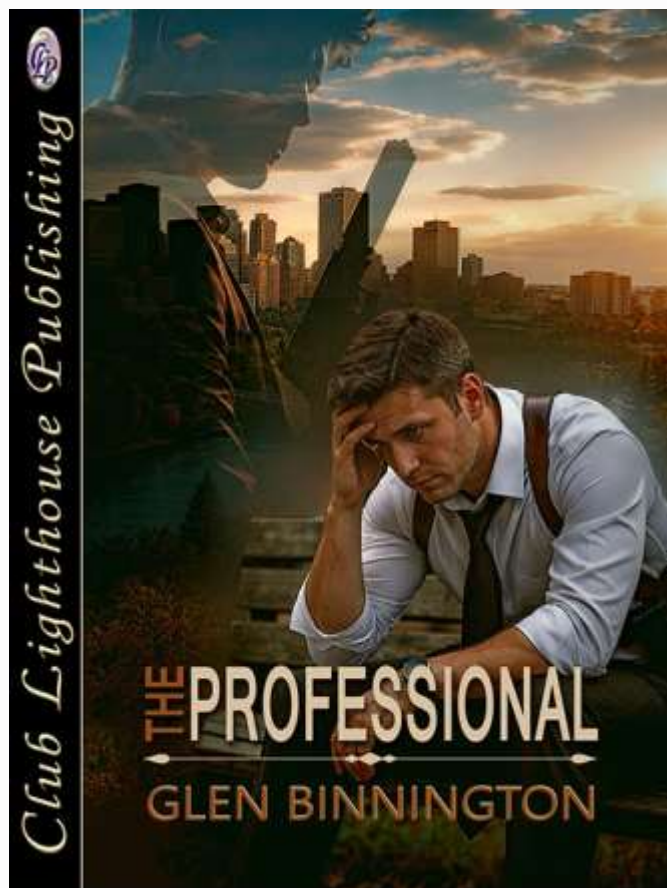

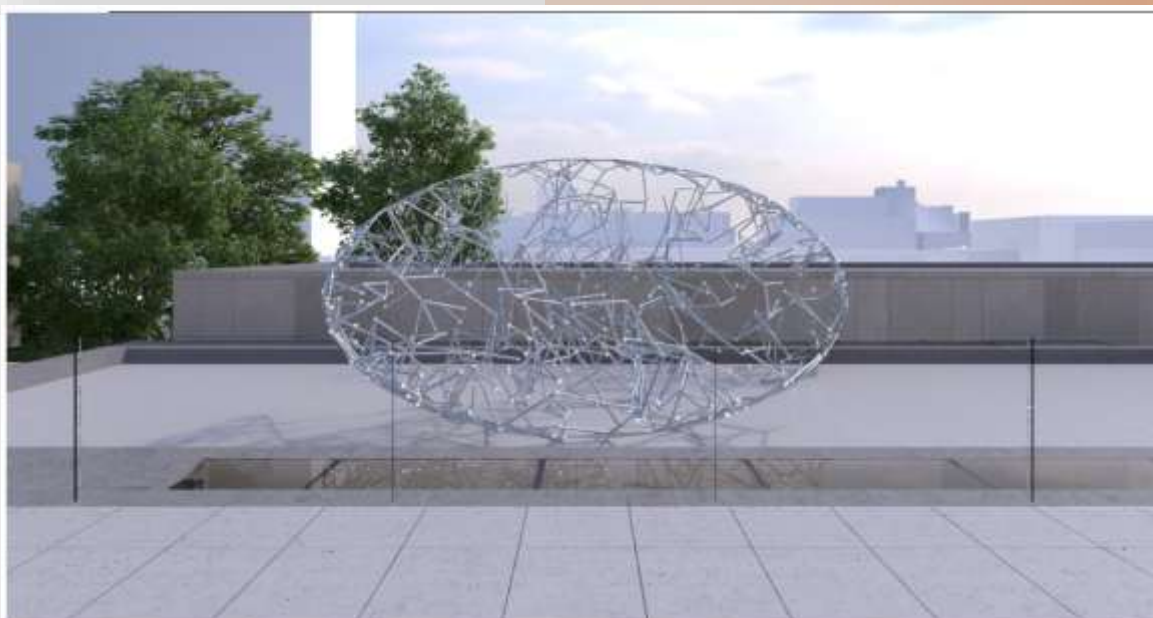

A ZA'ATAR INFUSED SHABBAT MENU

This week's double parsha, Tazria-Metzora, brings us a fascinating look at the ritual of purification. When a person is healed from *tzara'at* (often translated as leprosy), the Torah describes a beautiful, symbolic ceremony involving spring water, cedar wood, a scarlet thread, and—most importantly for our kitchen—**hyssop**.

For those of us who love Israeli flavors, hyssop is the star ingredient of **Za'atar**, the aromatic green spice blend that is a staple on every Middle Eastern table. This week, we are celebrating this ancient herb with a menu that highlights the earthy, zesty, and versatile profile of za'atar. I promise it will put a “zing” in your Shabbat that feels both historic and modern!

MATZAH IN SPACE?

The second Jewish NASA astronaut tried to bring the Passover staple to space with him back in 1985, but that particular space mission was doomed to fail.

This Passover, we're all thinking about space. Artemis II is on the first space mission to the moon in decades, launched into space on April 1, the day of the first night of Passover.

While the mission's commander, Reid Wiseman, might not be Jewish (though he [has shared pictures of Israel from space](#) and [attended Space Week](#) in the state as a guest astronaut), Jews have gone to space during Passover before — most notably, the second Jewish American NASA astronaut, Jeffrey Hoffman, whose first mission to space in 1985 coincided with the Jewish holiday.

Hoffman even tried to bring matzah onto Space Shuttle Discovery but unfortunately, the flight's food coordinator, unfamiliar with the Jewish bread

of affliction, vetoed that particular Jewish space mission. She cracked the matzah and saw the sheer number of crumbs it produced and simply told Hoffman, "That matzah is not making it to space." While matzah crumbs are the bane of our existence during Passover, with endless sweeping and vacuuming, turns out they can be literally deadly to astronauts in zero gravity, where inhaling crumbs can cause some real damage.

But fear not — over his five space missions, Hoffman did manage to bring lots of Judaica to space, including [several mezuzahs](#), [atarot \(the inscription on the collar of a tallit\)](#), a [miniature Torah scroll](#), a [yad](#), a [menorah](#), a [tallit](#) and perhaps most famously, a silver dreidel made in Jerusalem that he spun for Houston and all to see.
