"BO" IN A NUTSHELL ...

The name of the Parshah, "Bo," means "Come [to Pharaoh]" and it is found in [Exodus 10:1](#).

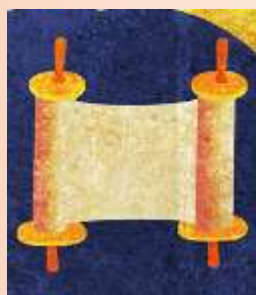
The last three of [the Ten Plagues](#) are visited on Egypt: a swarm of [locusts](#) devours all the crops and greenery; a thick, palpable [darkness](#) envelops the land; and all [the firstborn](#) of Egypt are killed at the stroke of [midnight](#) of the 15th of the month of [Nissan](#).

[G-d](#) commands the [first mitzvah](#) to be given to the people of Israel: to establish a [calendar](#) based on the monthly rebirth of the [moon](#). The [Israelites](#) are also instructed to bring a "[Passover offering](#)" to G-d: a [lamb or kid](#) goat is to be slaughtered, and its [blood sprinkled on the doorposts](#) and lintel of every Israelite home, so that [G-d](#) should [pass over](#) these homes when He comes to kill the Egyptian firstborn. The roasted meat of the offering is to be eaten that night together with [matzah](#) (unleavened bread) and [bitter herbs](#).

[The death of the firstborn](#) finally breaks Pharaoh's resistance, and he literally drives the children of Israel from his land. So hastily do they depart that there is no time for their dough to rise, and the only provisions they take along are unleavened. Before they go, they ask their Egyptian neighbors for gold, silver and garments—fulfilling [the promise made to Abraham](#) that his descendants would leave Egypt with great wealth.

The children of Israel are commanded to [consecrate all firstborn](#), and to observe the anniversary of the [Exodus](#) each year by removing all [leaven](#) from their possession for seven days, eating matzah, and [telling the story](#) of their redemption to their children. They are also commanded to wear [tefillin](#) on the arm and head as a reminder of the Exodus and their resultant commitment to G-d.

TORAH GEMS

CONCERN

The lofty attitude of the false leader, the scholars who stood apart from the people, has been characterized as one of contempt which stemmed from pride, justified seclusion and contributed to the prevailing condition of 'perud'. The attitude of the true leader, the zaddik, can also be characterized by a term—concern. Humility makes concern possible, because it implies the awareness of the other's existence.

But concern is more than awareness of another's existence. It means to care: to go out of oneself toward one's fellow man, to help him, to heal him, to raise him. It means the drawing together of what has been shattered. It means that a man alone is incomplete, only half a man, and that he must feel for another in order to be whole himself.

Only by helping to heal others is he himself healed. "The essence of returning to God is to turn others also." It means that the outpouring of God's concern for man overflows the zaddik's heart, reaching out to touch other men.

God's concern for man becomes the zaddik's concern for God's concern and, therefore, concern for man himself. "The zaddik thinks that each Israelite is a limb of the Shechinah," and thus, concern for the anguish of the Shechinah becomes concern for the anguish of the people. Concern means love and compassion.

The zaddik loves the people and finds even among the plainest of them signs of holiness.

Netanyahu fumes at Gaza oversight panel makeup as Trump invites Erdogan to peace board

Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu's office said Saturday that the White House's [unveiling](#) of a key international oversight panel for Gaza "was not coordinated with Israel and contradicts its policy," in a rare break with US President Donald Trump's administration that was met with a sharp rebuke from a senior US official.

Netanyahu appeared to be taking issue with the makeup of a new body called the executive board, which will include senior officials from Qatar and Turkey — two countries that have been highly critical of Israel's prosecution of the war in Gaza.

While it will technically operate beneath the Board of Peace — which is headed by Trump and made up of world leaders — the executive board will be more directly involved in overseeing the postwar management of Gaza, playing a critical role as opposed to the more symbolic Board of Peace.

Alex Bregman, who drew Jewish star on his cap after Oct. 7, inks \$175M deal with Cubs

Contract is the second-largest ever for a Jewish baseball player; his father has described his major league career as 'the fulfillment of four generations of short Jewish Bregmans'

JTA — For the second year in a row, Jewish star third baseman Alex Bregman has signed a lucrative free-agent contract with a team that is run by a Jewish executive and plays in a historic ballpark in a city with a significant Jewish community.

Last year, it was the Boston Red Sox. Now, Bregman is headed to the Chicago Cubs — a team whose Jewish fans possess almost religious devotion.

Bregman, who had opted out of a three-year, \$120 million deal with Boston, has signed a five-year, \$175 million pact with the Cubs. It is the second-largest contract ever signed by a Jewish ballplayer, behind Max Fried's \$218 million contract in 2024. Bregman previously signed a five-year, \$100 million extension with the Houston Astros in 2019.



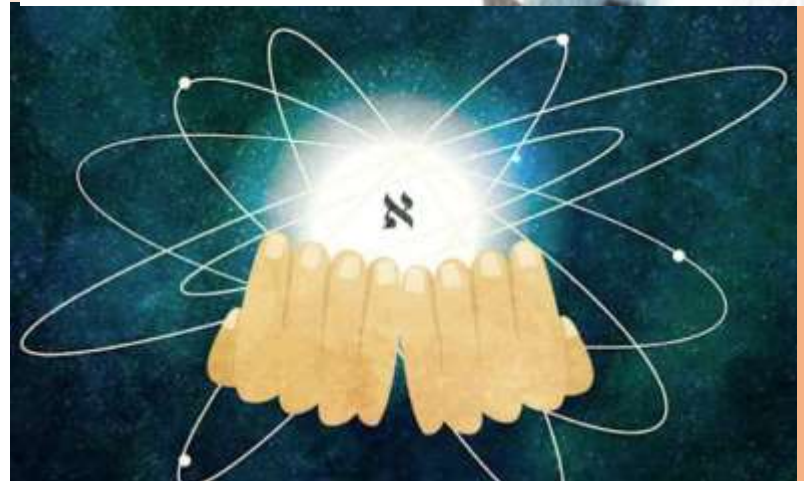
In an emailed letter sent to Brock Corydon School

families Wednesday, principal Lars Sigurdson and vice-principal Richard Hechter said they are in regular contact with the Winnipeg Police Service to ensure the school is safe and secure.

"We are aware of the recent incidents at Kelvin High School and Shaarey Zedek (synagogue), and we understand that these events may cause concern," said the letter. "Please know that the safety and well-being of our students remain our highest priority."

Children's House - the Organization's Flagship



In the Sheba Hospital – Tel Hashomer complex, near the Safra Children's Hospital, the Rachashei Lev organization created the Children's House in 2007, which is an activity center for children with cancer from all around the country.



Rachashei Lev offers free accommodation for children and their parents in 20 fully equipped suites. Each suite consists of three rooms, parents room, a children's room, a living room, a kitchenette and a balcony, which allows the child and his family to be comfortably accommodated in a spacious place and to maintain the integrity of the family.

The main building of the complex is an activity center for guests of the Children's House and for the children hospitalized in the oncology wards. There is a spacious dining room that offers daily hot meals, game rooms, computer room, a library, a synagogue, a playground and shaded outdoor play areas.

The Children's House allows cancer ill children and their families to be together throughout the difficult treatments and to receive personal assistance and support by the professional staff of the organization.

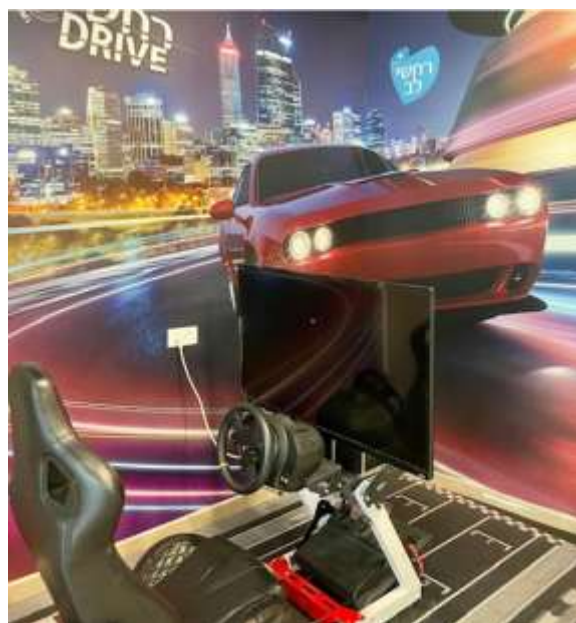

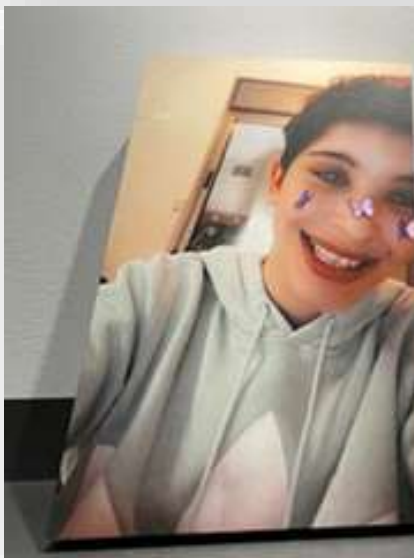
