SHEJAIYA, Gaza Strip —

Four months into a ceasefire with Hamas, the Israeli military is drawing up plans for a renewed offensive in the Gaza Strip to disarm the terror group by force, The Times of Israel has learned.

The US-brokered ceasefire plan reached in October foresees the demilitarization of Gaza, including the disarmament of Hamas, along with a gradual withdrawal of Israeli forces from the Strip. However, implementation of the plan has remained unclear, with Israeli officials increasingly believing that stripping Hamas of its weapons will be impossible without the Israel Defense Forces taking action.

Should hostilities renew, fighting is liable to be more intense and more widespread than previous rounds, as Israeli forces will no longer be constrained by the presence of hostages on Gazan soil.

Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu and US President Donald Trump have both insisted that the terror group must give up its weapons in the near future. Trump has repeatedly asserted that Hamas “promised” to lay down its arms, and has threatened the group over the issue.

However, at least publicly, Hamas has never agreed to lay down its arms.

"MISHPATIM" IN A NUTSHELL ...



The name of the Parshah, "Mishpatim," means "Ordinances" and it is found in [Exodus 21:1](#).

Following the [revelation at Sinai](#), [Gd](#) legislates a series of laws for the people of Israel. These include the laws of the [indentured servant](#); the penalties for murder, kidnapping, assault and theft; civil laws pertaining to redress of damages, the granting of [loans](#) and the responsibilities of the "[Four Guardians](#)"; and the rules governing the conduct of justice by courts of law.

Also included are laws warning against mistreatment of [foreigners](#); the observance of the [seasonal festivals](#), and the agricultural gifts that are to be brought to the [Holy Temple](#) in [Jerusalem](#); the prohibition against cooking [meat with milk](#); and the mitzvah of [prayer](#). Altogether, the [Parshah of Mishpatim](#) contains 53 [mitzvot](#)—23 imperative commandments and 30 prohibitions.

[Gd](#) promises to bring the people of Israel to the [Holy Land](#), and warns them against assuming the pagan ways of its current inhabitants.

The people of Israel proclaim, "[We will do and we will hear](#) all that [Gd](#) commands us." Leaving [Aaron](#) and [Hur](#) in charge in the Israelite camp, Moses ascends [Mount Sinai](#) and remains there for [forty days and forty nights](#) to receive the [Torah](#) from [Gd](#).

TORAH GEMS

"Greeting the Sabbath"

"Come! Let us sing to Hashem, let us call out to the Rock of our salvation." (Psalm 95:1)

Come [lit., go]! The term "come," represents an enthusiastic appeal, urging someone to surrender his doubts or leave a course of action to which he has become attached. Forget your preoccupation with material concerns and heretical beliefs, the Psalmist urges, and join me in singing God's praises! (Meiri).

Every week, on the eve of the Sabbath, the Jew abandons his pursuit of and preoccupation with the material world and envelops himself in the spirit of the Sabbath. In Talmudic times, people would don their finest clothing and, with the approach of the Sabbath, say, "Let us go out to greet the Sabbath queen" (Shabbos 119a).

This custom was broadened by the Kabbalists of 16th-century Safed, who would literally walk out to the fields to greet the incoming Sabbath. The custom of reciting Psalms 95-99 at the Friday night service was instituted by Rav Moshe Cordovero (1522-1570), one of Safed's greatest mystics (Rav Yaakov Emden). From Safed, the new liturgy spread gradually until it was adopted in virtually all Jewish communities. The common theme of these six psalms is that God is King of the universe; that He created heaven and earth in six days and rested on the seventh. Someone who recognizes God as Master during the six working days is prepared to welcome His intense spiritual presence on the holy Sabbath.

Now that I have had a few months to digest my Sar-El experience of February (2013), I wanted to share some of my thoughts with you. As with most other first time volunteers, I was not sure what to expect when I arrived at the airport in Tel Aviv with instructions to meet in front of the "Swarovski booth". Forty-five years ago when I reported for duty with the US Army, it was certainly not at the Swarovski booth!

My first encounter with Sar-El was with coordinator Pamela Lazarus who bore no resemblance to my long-ago drill sergeant. Pamela was clearly in charge, but needed no uniform or bluster to display command presence. It was the first indication that I had that things here would be different. Sar-El and the IDF were profoundly different from the military that I knew. In Sar-El we followed orders because we wanted to and because orders were communicated in a collegial,

outcome-oriented and egalitarian manner; we were all pulling in the same direction with no personal agendas! Soldiers, civilian supervisors and volunteers all knew the stakes - there were no slackers.

I felt at home in Israel even though it was only the second time I had been there. When I went to sleep the first night (on my half inch thick worn out mattress), I was emotionally in my own bed. My barracks mates, whom I had just met, were my family-Jews from around the world with whom I shared common ancestry and common beliefs. I immediately liked them and trusted them-and put up with their snoring as they did with mine. In the morning at flag raising, it was difficult to get out the words of HaTikvah while watching the blue and white Magen David hoisted into the Israeli sky. It's hard to sing while you're all choked up. I'll do better next time-maybe.
