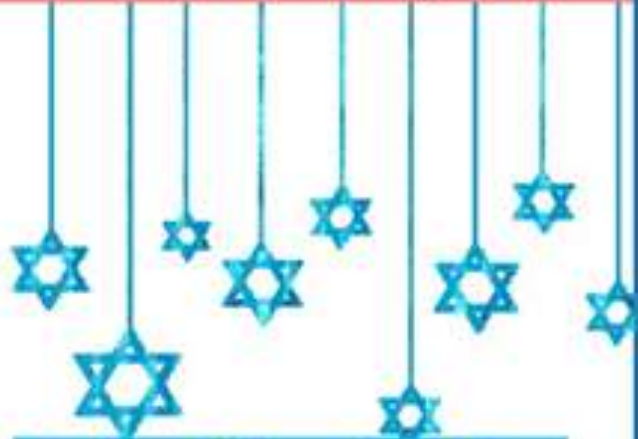

The name of the Parshah, "Chayei Sarah," means "The life of Sarah" and it is found in [Genesis 23:1](#).

[Sarah](#) dies at age 127 and is [buried](#) in the [Machpelah Cave](#) in [Hebron](#), which [Abraham](#) purchases from Ephron the Hittite for [four hundred shekels of silver](#).

[Abraham's servant Eliezer](#) is sent, laden with gifts, to Charan, to [find a wife](#) for [Isaac](#). At the village well, Eliezer asks G-d for a [sign](#): when the maidens come to the well, he will ask for some water to drink; the woman who will offer to give his camels to drink as well shall be the one destined for his master's son.

[Rebecca](#), the daughter of Abraham's nephew Bethuel, appears at the well and passes the

"test." Eliezer is invited to their home, where he repeats the story of the day's events. Rebecca returns with Eliezer to [the land of Canaan](#), where they encounter Isaac [praying](#) in the field. Isaac marries Rebecca, [loves](#) her, and is comforted over the loss of his mother.

Abraham takes a [new wife](#), Keturah ([Hagar](#)), and fathers [six additional sons](#), but Isaac is designated as his only heir. Abraham dies at age 175 and is buried beside Sarah by his two eldest sons, Isaac and [Ishmael](#).

TORAH GEMS

Sabbath Day Contemplation

"How great are Your deeds Hashem; exceedingly profound are Your thoughts." (Psalm 92:6) When I contemplate [on the Sabbath day] the magnitude of Creation, I realize How great are Your deeds. They are truly beyond my comprehension. Moreover, exceedingly profound are Your thoughts. I cannot fathom the reason for many phenomena. One perplexing question is why the Almighty created the world when He did, rather than earlier or later. The only answer for such a query is that God's will is utterly beyond our grasp (Radak). God is

constantly supervising and controlling every detail of creation, yet He has designed the universe so that all of His actions are hidden deep beneath a cloak of nature. Since God's hand is invisible, events appear to happen by themselves. This is all part of God's deep design for this world: it is a test to determine whether man will strive to detect God beneath His concealment and to live his life in accordance with the Divine plan (Malbim).

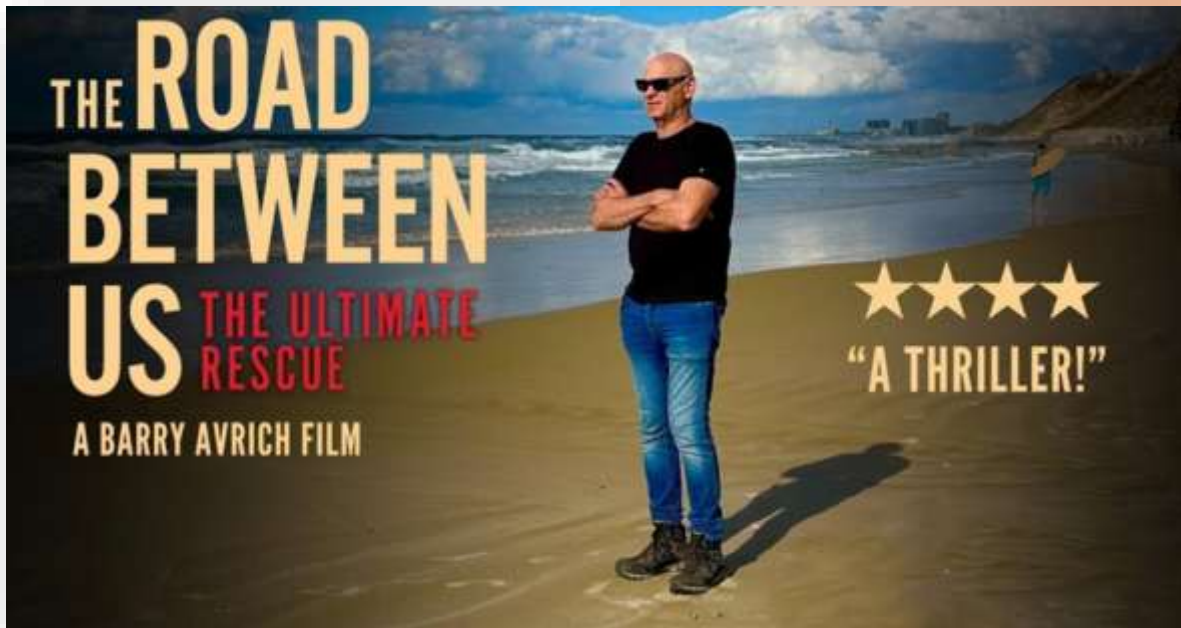

WHAT'S HAPPENING IN CALGARY ...



Calgary Jewish Federation is pleased to partner with the Beth Tzedec Calgary Jewish Film Festival for the screening of *The Road Between Us: The Ultimate Rescue* on Saturday, November 15 at 7:00pm.

Perhaps the most talked about film of this year's Toronto International Film Festival (TIFF), *The Road Between Us* was originally pulled from the TIFF lineup to great controversy, only to be ultimately reinstated, and going on to win TIFF's People's Choice Award for Best Documentary.

The film follows retired Israeli general Noam Tibon, who on October 7, 2023, received a desperate text from his son Amir: Hamas terrorists had stormed Amir's home on a kibbutz near the Gaza border, and he, his wife, and their two young daughters feared for their lives. With no time to spare and relying only on his instincts and military training, Noam sets out from Tel Aviv – 85 kilometres away – together with his wife Gali – navigating ambushes, roadblocks, and a collapsing security system – in a relentless race against time to reach and save their family.

Set against the backdrop of one of Israel's darkest days, and blending intimate firsthand testimony with the raw urgency of a survival thriller, this film is both a gripping cinematic retelling of an extraordinary rescue, and a profoundly human story about courage, family, resilience, and the human capacity for bravery and love in the darkest of moments.

The Muslim Kingdom and The Israeli Flag



The hexagram, while now primarily associated with Judaism and Israel, started off as a decorative sign beloved by other traditions. As far as anyone knows, it originated with King Solomon's signet ring. According to legends developed by medieval Arabic writers, the seal—granted directly by God—gave Solomon, who in Arabic is known as Sulayman, special powers, like commanding demons and speaking with animals.

Jews, Roma, and the Holocaust

Ari Joskowicz is Eugene Greener, Jr. Chair in Jewish Studies and Professor of Jewish Studies and History at Vanderbilt University. His work focuses on the relations between marginalized groups and on the material and financial changes that shape minority self-perceptions.

From concentration camps to the killing sites of mobile shooting squads, Jews and Roma experienced Nazi persecution in close proximity to each other. Yet, after the war, the world recognized the injustices both groups faced differently. While Jewish persecution histories became memorialized in museums, monuments, and college course the international community largely ignored the Roma genocide. How should we tell the story of the Holocaust in light of this unequal treatment? How have relations between Jews and Roma—from the 1930s to the present—influenced the way we think about Nazi racial persecution? How can we write histories of entangled persecution?

Trump writes to Herzog asking him to pardon Netanyahu amid 'unjustified' trial

President's office says only that requests for pardon must come through necessary channels; under the law, Lapid notes, one can only be eligible for a pardon after admitting guilt

President Isaac Herzog announced Wednesday that US President Donald Trump had written him to ask him to pardon Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu, who is currently standing trial on charges of bribery, fraud and breach of trust.

Trump, who was himself convicted on 34 felony counts in a hush-money case in 2024, has called several times in recent months for Herzog to pardon Netanyahu, including during a speech at the Knesset in October.

Herzog has thus far demurred, pointing to the process of requesting a pardon, which requires the accused or members of their family to make the case for a pardon.

It is my honor to write to you at this historic time, as we have, together, just secured peace that has been sought for at least 3,000 years," wrote Trump in his letter, received by Herzog on Wednesday morning.


"I hereby call on you to fully pardon Benjamin Netanyahu, who has been a formidable and decisive War Time Prime Minister," wrote Trump, "and is now leading Israel into a time of peace, which includes my continued work with key Middle East leaders to add many additional countries to the world changing Abraham Accords."

On Yom Hashoah (Holocaust Remembrance Day) students participate in a three-kilometer march from Auschwitz to Birkenau as a silent tribute to victims of the Shoah. In Israel, students observe Yom Ha'zikaron (Israel's Memorial Day) and celebrate Yom Ha'atzmaut (Israel's Independence Day). Students who will be in Grades 10, 11, and 12 during the school year are welcome to apply for this incredible experience.
