"VAYAKHEIL-PEKUDEI" IN A NUTSHELL ...

TORAH GEM

A Link with Hashem

"If one turns his ear from hearing the Torah, his prayer too, will be [considered] an abomination." (Proverbs 18:9)

Prayer is not merely a petition for one's needs. Rather, it is a means of spiritual growth and bonding with the Creator, but this is stifled when one distances himself from the Torah (Michtav MeEliyahu). If a scholar is not interested in hearing someone else's words of Torah, Hashem will have no interest in hearing his words of prayer (Metzudos). Alshich adds that if the scholar has no interest because he has already learned the topic, Hashem may tell him, as it were, "And I have heard the same prayer from you numerous times before."

R' Aharon also explains that both Torah and prayer form a link between a person and Hashem. Through Torah, a person connects to God's word, and through prayer he communes with Hashem. This concept is found in Maharal (Nesiv HaAvodah Ch. 2). He explains that prayer attaches a person to Hashem, even when he petitions for his physical needs. However, if he ignores Torah study, then his prayer is merely a series of requests for bodily well-being, and this God abhors.

The name of the first Parshah, "Vayakhel," means "And he gathered" and it is found in [Exodus 35:1](#). The name of the [Parshah](#), "Pekudei," means "Amounts of" and is found in [Exodus 38:21](#).

[Moses](#) assembles the [people of Israel](#) and reiterates to them the commandment to observe the [Shabbat](#). He then conveys [G-d's](#) instructions regarding the making of the [Mishkan](#) (Tabernacle). The people donate the required materials in abundance, bringing gold, silver and copper; blue-, purple- and red-dyed wool; goat hair, spun linen, animal skins, wood, olive oil, herbs and precious stones. Moses has to tell them to stop giving.

A team of wise-hearted [artisans](#) make the Mishkan and its furnishings (as detailed in the previous Torah readings of [Terumah](#), [Tetzaveh](#) and [Ki Tisa](#)): three layers of roof coverings; 48 gold-plated wall panels, and 100 silver foundation sockets; the *parochet* (veil) that separates between the Sanctuary's two chambers, and the *masach* (screen) that fronts it; the [ark](#), and its cover with the cherubim; the table and its [showbread](#); the [seven-branched menorah](#) with its spe-

cially prepared oil; the golden altar and the [incense](#) burned on it; the anointing oil; the outdoor altar for burnt offerings and all its implements; the hangings, posts and foundation sockets for the courtyard; and the basin and its pedestal, made out of copper [mirrors](#).

An accounting is made of the gold, silver and copper donated by the people for the making of the [Mishkan](#). [Betzalel](#), [Aholiav](#) and their [assistants](#) make the eight [priestly garments](#)—the apron, [breastplate](#), cloak, crown, hat, tunic, sash and breeches—according to the specifications communicated to [Moses](#) in the Parshah of [Tetzaveh](#).

The [Mishkan](#) is completed and all its components are brought to Moses, who erects it and anoints it with the holy anointing oil, and initiates [Aaron](#) and his four sons into the [priesthood](#).

A [cloud](#) appears over the Mishkan, signifying the [Divine Presence](#) that has come to dwell within it.

Jewish Family Services Edmonton Survey

Jewish Family Services Edmonton (JFSE), in partnership with the Jewish Federation of Edmonton, is inviting members of the community to share their perspectives through a new survey. Administered by Y Station Communications & Research, this initiative seeks to better understand the mental and emotional wellbeing of Edmonton's Jewish community.

Over the past several years, JFSE has seen growing demand for counselling, social supports, and community connection. At the same time, the world around us has changed in ways that affect how people experience stress, belonging, and resilience.

By listening directly to community members, JFSE hopes to better understand current needs, identify gaps, and ensure that services and supports continue to evolve in meaningful and responsive ways.

The survey is called the Mental & Emotional Needs Survey of Community Health (MENSCH). In Yiddish, a *mensh* is someone of integrity and heart... the kind of person who shows up for others.

By taking a few minutes to share your perspective, you're doing something very *menschy*: helping strengthen the wellbeing of our whole community.

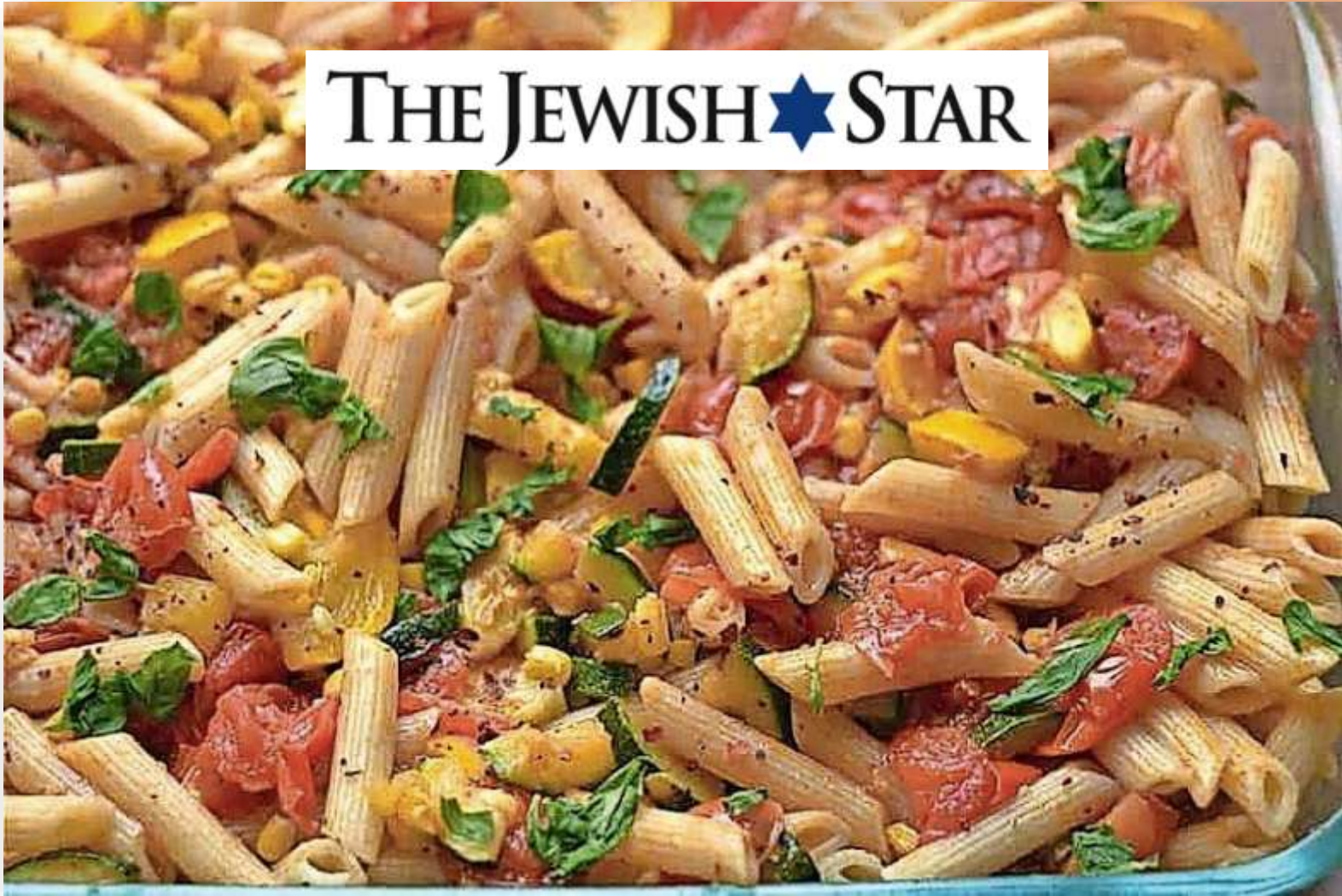


One of my favorite things to do in the kitchen is turn leftovers into do-overs, pantry excess included. So here are ten things you can make to get rid of your chometz!
