What Is Tisha B'Av?

JULY 22-23



Tisha B'Av, the 9th day of the month of Av (July 22-23, 2026), is the saddest day on the Jewish calendar, on which we fast, deprive ourselves and pray. It is the culmination of the Three Weeks, a period of time during which we mark the destruction of the Holy Temple in Jerusalem.

TORAH PORTION VA'ETCHANAN"



The name of the Parshah, "Va'etchanan," means "I entreated," and it is found in [Deuteronomy 3:23](#).

[Moses](#) tells the people of Israel how he implored [G'd](#) to allow him to enter [the Land of Israel](#), but [G'd](#) refused, instructing him instead to ascend a mountain and see [the Promised Land](#).

Continuing his "review of the Torah," Moses describes [Exodus from Egypt](#) and [the Giving of the Torah](#), declaring them unprecedented events in human history. "Has there ever occurred this great thing, or has the likes of it ever been heard? Did ever a people hear the voice of [G'd](#) speaking out of the midst of the fire . . . and live? . . . You were shown, to know, that the L'd is

[G'd](#) . . . [there is none else beside Him.](#)"

Moses predicts that in future generations the people will turn away from [G'd](#), [worship idols](#), and be [exiled](#) from their land and scattered amongst the nations; but from there they will seek [G'd](#), and [return](#) to obey His [commandments](#).

[Our Parshah](#) also includes a repetition of the [Ten Commandments](#), and the verses of the [Shema](#), which declare the fundamentals of the [Jewish faith](#): the [unity](#) of [G'd](#) ("Hear O Israel: the L'd our G'd, the L'd is one"); the mitzvot to [love](#) [G'd](#), to [study His Torah](#), and to bind "these words" as [tefillin](#) on our arms and heads, and inscribe them in the [mezuzot](#) affixed on the [doorposts](#) of our homes.

TORAH GEMS

Psalm 119: Mem

"All day long I love Your Torah! All day long it is my conversation." (Psalm 119:97)

Mem (Psalm 119:97-104):

The Talmud (Shabbos 104a) states that the letter Mem represents the word 'Mamar', pronouncement, referring to the ten pronouncements with which God created the world (Maharsha ibid.). It is interesting to note that the numerical value of mem is forty, and according to our Rabbis (Sotah 2a; Niddah 30a), the embryo is formed in forty days. Thus we find in many instances that forty symbolizes creation. An example is Israel's forty-year sojourn in the barren desert,

during which the Jewish nation was shaped from a multitude of fugitive slaves. Here the Psalmist sings of his love for Torah, which is the very essence and purpose of God's creation.

Tisha B'Av 101

Tisha B'Av, the ninth day of the month of Av, is the major day of communal mourning in the Jewish calendar.



Tisha B'Av, the ninth day of the month of Av (which month coincides with July and/or August), is the major day of communal mourning in the Jewish calendar.

Although a large number of disasters are said to have befallen the Jews on this day, the major commemoration is of the destruction of the First and Second Temples in Jerusalem in 586 B.C.E. and 70 C.E., respectively. Central to the observance of this day is fasting.

Update on US attacks on Iran

US launches 8th night of strikes on Iran to 'punish' IRGC for deadly Jordan attack

Iran reports strikes in south and in Strait of Hormuz; US bases in Kuwait come under fire, UAE threatened; Washington warns Iran-backed groups might target Americans abroad

The United States on Sunday said it had completed an eighth straight night of strikes against Iran, saying they were intended to “punish” Iran’s Islamic Revolutionary Guard Corps for a deadly strike that killed two US military personnel [in Jordan](#) and left another missing.

Amid the spiraling conflict in the region, the US issued an alert to its citizens across the globe, warning they could be targeted by Iran and its allies.

US Central Command said in a statement that the airstrikes began at 6 p.m. ET (2200 GMT) on Saturday, at the direction of US President Donald Trump.

“The strikes are designed to further degrade Iran’s ability to threaten commercial shipping in the Strait of Hormuz and swiftly punish Islamic Revolutionary Guard Corps forces who launched attacks against American service members in Jordan last night,” the command said.

CENTCOM did not provide any details on the retaliatory strike against IRGC forces or its results.

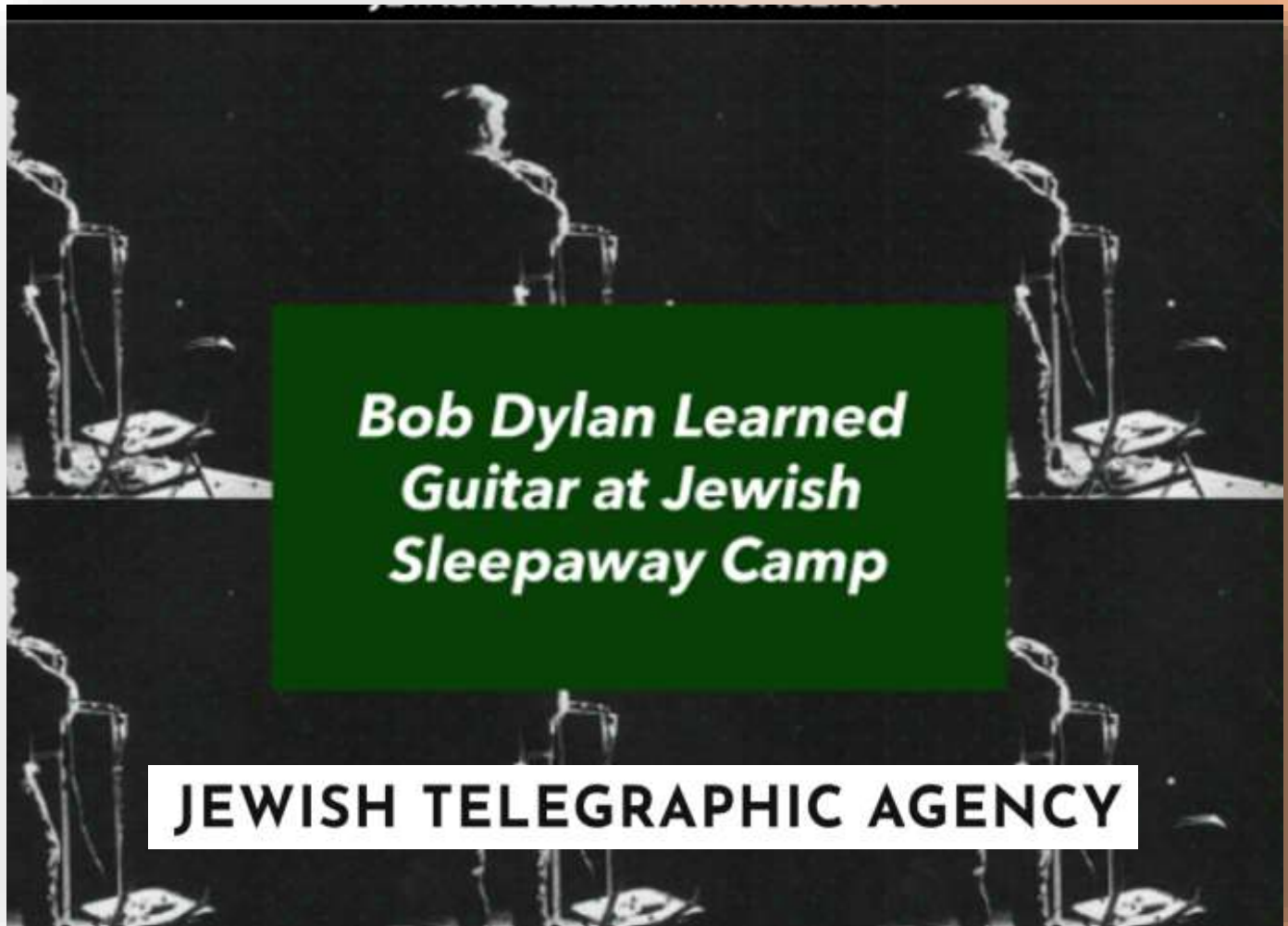

The JDIC provides health, wellness, recreational, nutritional, social and educational programs and services to seniors. The JDIC is a vibrant, inclusive hub dedicated to enhancing the lives of seniors aged 55 and over, from all walks of life and faiths. The Centre includes a large social hall, programming area and a non-certified kosher dairy kitchen. It provides a warm, welcoming environment where members can connect through diverse cultural, educational, and recreational programming. The Centre is known for fostering intergenerational connections and celebrating the rich cultural heritage of its members.

Position Overview

The Executive Director (ED) provides strategic leadership and operational management to fulfill JDIC's mission. Israel enters the Three Weeks of mourning today, three days into Av, as its politics fracture in full public view: the Knesset dissolved this week after a bruising legislative blitz, a media overhaul law passed 53-48 on near party lines, and a Shas leader has publicly declared he "no longer recognizes" the High Court's authority. Meanwhile the war footing with Iran continues to test national unity from without.

The sages did not blame Rome for the Temple's fall - they blamed Jews for how they treated one another. As Israel heads toward an October election amid deep internal division, the warning feels less like ancient history than a headline.
