Happy New Year

"VAYECHI" IN A NUTSHELL ...



The name of the Parshah, "Vayechi," means "And he lived" and it is found in [Genesis 47:28](#).

Jacob lives the final [17 years](#) of his [life in Egypt](#). Before his passing, he asks [Joseph](#) to take an oath that he will bury him in the [Holy Land](#). He blesses Joseph's two sons, [Manasseh and Ephraim](#), elevating them to the status of his own sons as progenitors of [tribes](#) within the nation of Israel.

The patriarch desires to reveal the [end of days](#) to his children, but is [prevented from doing so](#).

Jacob blesses his sons, [assigning to each his role as a tribe](#): Judah will produce leaders, legislators and kings; priests will come from [Levi](#), scholars from Issachar, seafarers from Zebulun, schoolteachers from [Simeon](#), soldiers from Gad, judges from Dan, olive-growers from Asher, and so on. Reuben is rebuked for "confusing his father's marriage bed"; Simeon and Levi, for the [massacre of Shechem](#) and the plot against Joseph. Naphtali is granted the swiftness of a deer, [Benjamin](#) the ferociousness

of a wolf, and Joseph is blessed with beauty and fertility.

A large [funeral](#) procession consisting of Jacob's descendants, Pharaoh's ministers, the leading citizens of Egypt and the Egyptian cavalry accompanies Jacob on his final journey to the Holy Land, where he is buried in the [Machpelah Cave in Hebron](#).

Joseph, too, [dies in Egypt](#), at the age of 110. He, too, instructs that [his bones be taken out of Egypt](#) and buried in the Holy Land, but this would come to pass only with the [Israelites' exodus from Egypt](#) many years later. Before his passing, [Joseph conveys to the Children of Israel the testament](#) from which they will draw their hope and faith in the difficult years to come: "G‑d will surely remember you, and bring you up out of this land to the land of which He swore to [Abraham, Isaac and Jacob](#)."

TORAH GEMS

He Recompenses

"If you will say, 'Surely we did not know this!' But the One Who resides in hearts, He understands; and the Protector of your soul, He knows; and He recompenses a man according to his deeds." (Proverbs 24:12)

"And He recompenses a man according to his deeds": This means that a person is held as responsible for passive inaction as for active sinning. The verse says that a person may be reluctant to sacrifice his time and money in order to help a stranger, but if he does it, Hashem rewards a

man according to his deeds, in unimaginable ways (see [Isaiah 64:3](#)). The verse states that Hashem perceives the heart and pays according to his deeds. If he tries but is unsuccessful, Hashem rewards him as if he succeeded (Me'am Loez, citing Mussar Av).



Netflix's new hit documentary "Murder in Monaco" doesn't offer new answers about the 1999 death of Edmond Safra, the Jewish billionaire and banking scion, who was killed, along with one of the nurses in his employ, Vivian Torrente, in an apartment fire deemed to be arson. 

